# 5th Grade Summer Movie Poster Reading Project

Fifth Grade is a fun, busy, and challenging year! In order to keep your child prepared for 5<sup>th</sup> grade, please encourage your child to continue reading throughout the summer. We have enclosed a recommended reading list for fifth grade. In addition, please have your child complete the required Reading Project and questions.

## Choose one book from the list below:

- The Unteachables: by: Gordon Korman
- The One and Only Bob by: Katherine Applegate
- Because of Mr. Terupt by: Rob Buyea
- Bridge to Terabithia by: Katherine Paterson
- Bud, Not Buddy By: Christopher Paul Curtis
- Shiloh by: Phyllis Reynolds Naylor

Materials: white paper, tag paper, or poster board, markers, colored pencils, crayons, glue, pictures etc.. The project must be neatly handwritten or typed.

### Requirements for project:

- Read one of the summer books listed above. If you choose to read more than one book, you need to prepare for <u>only one</u> movie poster for one of the books.
- 2. Your poster must contain pictures or original art to represent the theme of your novel. Theme is one word that describes the message or "big idea" that the author is trying to convey. It could be friendship, love, courage, war, etc.
- 3. You must have two quotes from the novel that tell something important about the theme.
- 4. List three "movie stars" (characters from the book) and briefly describe the character.
- Taglines: Create two catchy slogans or taglines that capture the main theme or conflict of the story (like a movie trailer might have!) (example: "This was like a ride to a magical world" -Washington Post)
- 6. You must include a short summary (at least 3 sentences) of what the novel is mostly about.
- 7. Your poster must be colorful and creative
- 8. You must also fill out the **book report questions** on the second page.
